## Allotment Bonfire Rules

Whilst bonfires are permitted, the Parish Council would ask that you first consider whether a bonfire is necessary as smoke from them often causes a nuisance to other plot holders and surrounding properties. Perhaps other methods of disposing of your garden waste could be considered, for instance, composting or disposal at the local waste disposal site.

**Bonfires are only permitted between 1<sup>st</sup> October and 31<sup>st</sup> March and the following must be strictly adhered to:-**

1. The tenant hereby agrees with the Council as follows:
  - a) No material other than that produced on your plot is to be burnt on site.
  - b) Non vegetable matter, such as plastic, rubber, and roofing felt, carpet etc. Shall not be burnt.
  - c) Only burn *during daylight hours* when suitable weather conditions permit, i.e. no wind drift. This is to avoid causing a nuisance to other plot holders and local residents.
  - d) Only burn on your own plot, do not light fires for others.
  - e) Extinguish the bonfire *before leaving the site*; do not let the fire smoulder after you have gone.
  - f) In the event of a reasonable complaint to either the Parish Council or plot holder from another tenant or member of the public, with regard to a nuisance being caused, the bonfire must be extinguished immediately.

**Please note: - Any violation of times or conditions will lead to the termination of the tenancy.**
